THE CONSTITUTION OF INDIA



PREAMBLE

WE, THE PEOPLE OF INDIA, having solemnly resolved to constitute India into a SOVEREIGN, SOCIALIST SECULAR DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC and to secure to all its citizens:

LIBERTY: of Thought, Expression, Belief, Faith and Worship;

EQUALITY: of Status and of Opportunity; and to promote among them all

FRATERNITY: assuring the Dignity of the individual and the Unity and Integrity of the Nation;

IN OUR CONSTITUENT ASSEMBLY this twenty-sixth day of November, 1949, do HEREBY ADOPT, ENACT AND GIVE TO OURSELVES THIS CONSTITUTION.

SCHOOL RULES

SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

- All students must attend school regularly. Students who are not present on the first and the last days of each term will be charged with a fine.
- Attendance on the reporting day after Dussehra, Christmas and Diwali holidays is compulsory.
- It is mandatory for students to have 80% attendance to be eligible for promotion.
- Students are not allowed to leave the school premises during the school hours.

VALUABLES:

• Students should not bring any expensive articles to school. Jewellery, cell phones and electronic gadgets are not permitted. Pupils of Class 8 and upwards must submit their phones to class teacher when they enter the campus and take it when leaving school.

GUIDELINES FOR PARENTS:

- Check NLP notifications and messages from the school daily.
- Parents should attend all Parent Connect Programmes (PCP) and Parent-Teacher Meetings (PTM) to stay updated with their child's progress.
- Do not encourage private tuition.
- Check your ward's school bag every day and make sure that the school diary, books, notebooks and other resources are sent as per the time table.
- Assignments and projects should be submitted on time, as it is an important part of the evaluation.
- Parental support is required in collecting information and pictures required for the assignments.
- Giving gifts to staff members is strictly prohibited.



DISCIPLINE:

- Running, playing, shouting and whistling inside the school building during class hours is not allowed.
- Every student is given a school diary which he/she must bring to school every day. Students should not tear out any pages or scribble on the diary. If a student's diary is found like this, a new diary will be given with a penalty.
- Irregular attendance, unsatisfactory performance in studies, disobedience to teachers, stealing, writing or scribbling on the walls, malpractice in classwork, failure to bring the required books to school, damaging school property or any other unruly behaviour will not be tolerated.
- After a warning for unruly behaviour has been issued in writing, the next time around, the child will be barred from attending school and his/her name will be struck off the rolls.
- Students are not allowed to consume eatables during class hours.
- Every student contributes to the discipline and high standard of the school through his/her manners and conduct. The school expects strict discipline.
- In case of damage to school property, the parent of the student must replace/reimburse immediately.

Any serious act of indiscipline on the part of a student will lead to his / her dismissal from the school. Whenever parents are called by the administrator, principal or manager, they should report to the school as per the request.



PARENT TEACHER INTERACTION:

The school will hold parent-teacher interactions during the academic year on Saturdays or any other convenient days. All the parents must attend the meetings. Parents/guardians are not allowed to send any representative for such meetings.

REMEDIAL TEACHING:

The school encourages students to develop the habit of self-study. We believe that additional private tuitions are detrimental to the students. The school provides remedial teaching aimed at improving a student's academic performance. Teachers will identify the areas where students are struggling and provide necessary support by clearing doubts, clarifying concepts and strengthening their skills.

CO CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES:

For their all-round development, students are encouraged to participate in school activities, play games and take part in sports (Badminton, squash, table tennis, chess, volleyball, skating, etc.).

Infirmary Policy:

In case of minor physical injury or any other illness, the following steps will be taken:

- 1. A primary check-up will be done in the infirmary by the nurse.
- 2. Appropriate first aid and care will be provided.
- 3. If a student recovers and is deemed fit to continue classes, then he/she will be sent to class. If not, the parent or guardian will be contacted and the student will be sent home with an exit gate pass.

In case of severe casualties, like bleeding wounds, fractures, etc., the following steps will be taken:

- 1. Parents will be informed immediately so that the child can be shifted to a hospital.
- 2. Simultaneously, students will be administered first aid, revived or stabilised.
- 3. Students will be shifted to Loutolim PHC or District Hospital Margao if there is a delay from the parents' side in completing necessary requirements.

TRANSPORT:

- This is a facility provided to students on request from parents; therefore, the school shall not in any way be responsible for any unforeseen incidents. Do not delay the bus when it comes to pick and drop your child as it will not wait if you are late.
- Parents should be present at the pick-up and drop point. In case there is no one to receive the child at the drop point, the child will be brought back to school. Any child who misbehaves on the bus will be asked to discontinue the bus service.
- In case of a change in address, please inform the school and not the bus drivers. Even if instructions are given directly to the driver, no changes will be allowed without the permission of the school.
- Bus fee is billed twice a year.
- The full term fee has to be paid even if a student discontinues studies in between. Notice for withdrawal from the transport services should be given one month in advance.
- Fees once paid cannot be refunded.



RECOMMENDATIONS TO PARENTS

- Parents are expected to cooperate with the school authorities on their insistence of punctuality, discipline, cleanliness, etc.
- Parents are expected to respect the school and those working in the school, including the principal, and the teaching and non-teaching staff.
- Parents are advised to check their children's diaries for remarks, sign the remarks, if any and take necessary action.
- Parents should ensure that their ward's uniform is clean and tidy.
- Parents themselves should collect the report card and attend the P.T.G regularly.
- Parents should meet the teachers whenever their presence is requested and find out how they can help their children progress in academics.
- Criticism of a teacher/school in the child's presence is discouraged as the child loses respect for the school and his/her teachers. If you have a legitimate complaint, meet the principal with a prior appointment.
- Parents who feel their child needs help in a particular subject must meet the principal with a prior appointment. Extra classes will be provided to the child, if required, during or after school hours.
- Parents must not dictate to the school authorities on school policies.
- Parents should not encourage their children to miss classes as this might hamper his/her progress.
- Students going for field trips / picnics should be on their best behaviour. The school shall take all the required measures for their safety but cannot be held responsible for accidents.
- Parents are not allowed to meet the teachers during class hours without the permission of the principal.
- Competition/Activity dates can be changed at the discretion of the school authorities.
- Parents must inform the school in case of a change in name or address of the ward or any other changes (in the information given to the school) immediately.
- Appointment with the director should not be taken for simple matters and should be taken at least a week in advance after clearly stating the reason.
- You should fill out the appointment slip to seek an appointment with the principal/director.



SAFETY RECOMMENDATIONS:

- Parents/guardians should carry their ID cards while visiting the school or while picking their ward from the school.
- Guardians recommended by parents will be allowed to pick the students from school only if he/she
 carries the duplicate ID card issued by the school and after giving prior information to the school
 office.
- Do not drop your child at school before 7:30 a.m. and pick them up from school latest by 2:00 p.m. The school will not be responsible for the safety of your ward after 2:00 p.m.
- The school management may change or delete any of the foregoing rules or add new rules for the betterment of the school. School fees may be revised annually at the sole discretion of the management.

- Students are able to understand the given homework.
- Homework is regularly examined with immediate feedback from concerned teachers.
- Parents are informed about the irregularities, if any, regarding the completion and timely submission of the work given.
- Homework is based on the learning outcomes of the concepts covered in the class.

From grade I onwards, homework will be assigned for 2 subjects per day. School will maintain a homework timetable as given below:

CREOVILLE - THE PRE PRIMARY CURRICULUM

CreoVille is designed with a vision of providing the best quality education and care to your child at par with international standards. It is a transformative early year solution from **Next Education India Pvt Ltd**.

The organisation believes in the integration of education with technology and has set a benchmark in the academic spectrum, hence, creating a better tomorrow for the Gen Next.

CreoVille incorporates international academic practices with the aim of exposing children to quality education. The curriculum focuses on all three domains of development: cognitive, affective and psychomotor.

NURSERY

Assessments:

Through this assessment, the students are observed on a regular basis regarding their progress in academics. It includes conversations, quizzes, class-work, visual testing, oral testing, projects, assignments, practical, class test, homework, etc. These formative assessments are partly informal and partly formal, however, the date and time of test will be announced beforehand. These assessments will be conducted in the regular periods of concerned subjects.

Evaluations:

This exam is the final assessment of the student's performance. This assessment will be conducted twice a year, at the end of each term in the form of a proper pen and paper-based test conducted by the schools themselves.

Students have to secure 33% marks out of the marks earmarked in each subject covering 100% syllabus of the subject and 33% marks out of the marks earmarked in each subject for internals separately.

CBSE has introduced internal assessment in all subjects.

Parts of Internal Assessment

Internal assessment has mainly three parts. These are:

- 1. Periodic Assessment
- 2. Portfolio
- 3. Subject Enrichment Activities

Subject Enrichment Activities

Languages: Listening and Speaking Skills

Math, Computer/IT and Science: Experiments and Lab Work

Social Science: Project Work / Lab

The children will be assessed on an 8-point scale.
